Sports Premium Funding Spending Statement 2019 - 2020

Ridgeway received an allocation of **£11,400** in November 2019 (within the 2019– 2020 Budget) and a further allocation of **£8,140** in May 2020 (within the 2020 – 2021 Budget). This gave a total allocation of **£19,540** for the academic year 19 - 20

Purpose of the funding

All schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but there is freedom to choose how we do it.

At Ridgeway, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

1. Progressive Sports provide 2 hours per week of high quality sporting provision as part of our Fast Forward enrichment activities. This is provided within the school day so that all children have the opportunity to benefit from it over the course of a school year.	£1,200	<i>This took place during the autumn and first half of the spring term;</i> <i>From the point of school closure, progressive attended site for 2 PM sessions until May half term to provide PE activities for groups of key worker children</i>
2. Participation in sporting competitions and events through the Burntwood Cooperative Learning Trust facilitated by Progressive Sports	£500	<i>Competitions across the trust took place only in the autumn term.</i>
3. The alternative sporting provision which we offer our KS pupils during the spring / summer terms means that all of our children get to experience activities which some wouldn't usually have the opportunity to do. This adds to the cultural capital of our pupils and enables them to learn a new sport and develop new skills.		<i>These activities were not able to take place due to the closure of schools and all sporting and leisure facilities;</i>
4. The sports funding enables our Y6 pupils to swim for a six week block during the summer term as a the last half term in order to meet the national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety by the end of primary school.		<i>These activities were not able to take place due to the closure of schools and all sporting and leisure facilities;</i>
5. Further contribution to the studio build		<i>Due to other activiites not being able to take place, the majority of the PE and Sports funding will be used towards the studio</i>
